there is a clear system of referral in place for students in need of support. Work has been completed on the development of a guidance plan, and this represents the first stage in the compilation of a whole-school guidance plan. This work is now progressing.

The deployment of the additional allocation of teaching hours to provide support for students with special educational needs should be planned for in advance, and included in the main timetable at the time of its construction, with due regard being given to reducing the number of teachers involved in providing the additional teaching supports, thus allowing for more continuity and ensuring less fragmentation of support.

A timetabled weekly meeting time should be scheduled for the core SEN team to allow for the necessary planning for continuity of provision in order to meet the identified and priority needs of the students.

Very good progress

The deployment of the additional allocation of teaching hours is now planned in advance with the assistance of the special education needs (SEN) co-ordinator, and is factored into the main timetable at the time of its construction. The ways in which these hours are used to support students is fully recorded. While the number of teachers involved remains high, there is a clear focus on ensuring the optimal use of the allocated resources for the benefit of students. Continuity of provision has been strengthened through the development of team-teaching in a number of key subjects.

The SEN team now has a timetabled weekly meeting with senior management which is used to plan, organise and monitor all aspects of provision for students with special educational needs.

As part of school self-evaluation (SSE), the school should publish or make available to parents a synopsis of its school improvement plan and SSE report.

Very good progress

The school's SSE report and school improvement plan are now published on the school's website.

Summary of findings

• Excellent work has been undertaken by the new senior management team in implementing all of the recommendations from the WSE-MLL report. It is evident that the report has been carefully studied, and the recommendations used by senior management to bring about a significant level of improvement in the structures and systems in place in the school, in particular in relation to the work of key teams and in the provision of support for students. The quality of the work undertaken to date by the new management team is very high.

No further recommendations arise in relation to the recommendations in the original report.
